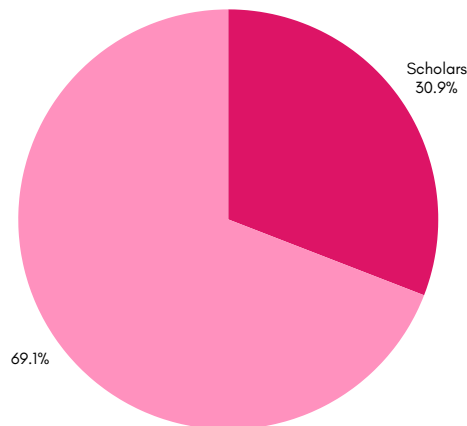


REDUCED INEQUALITIES

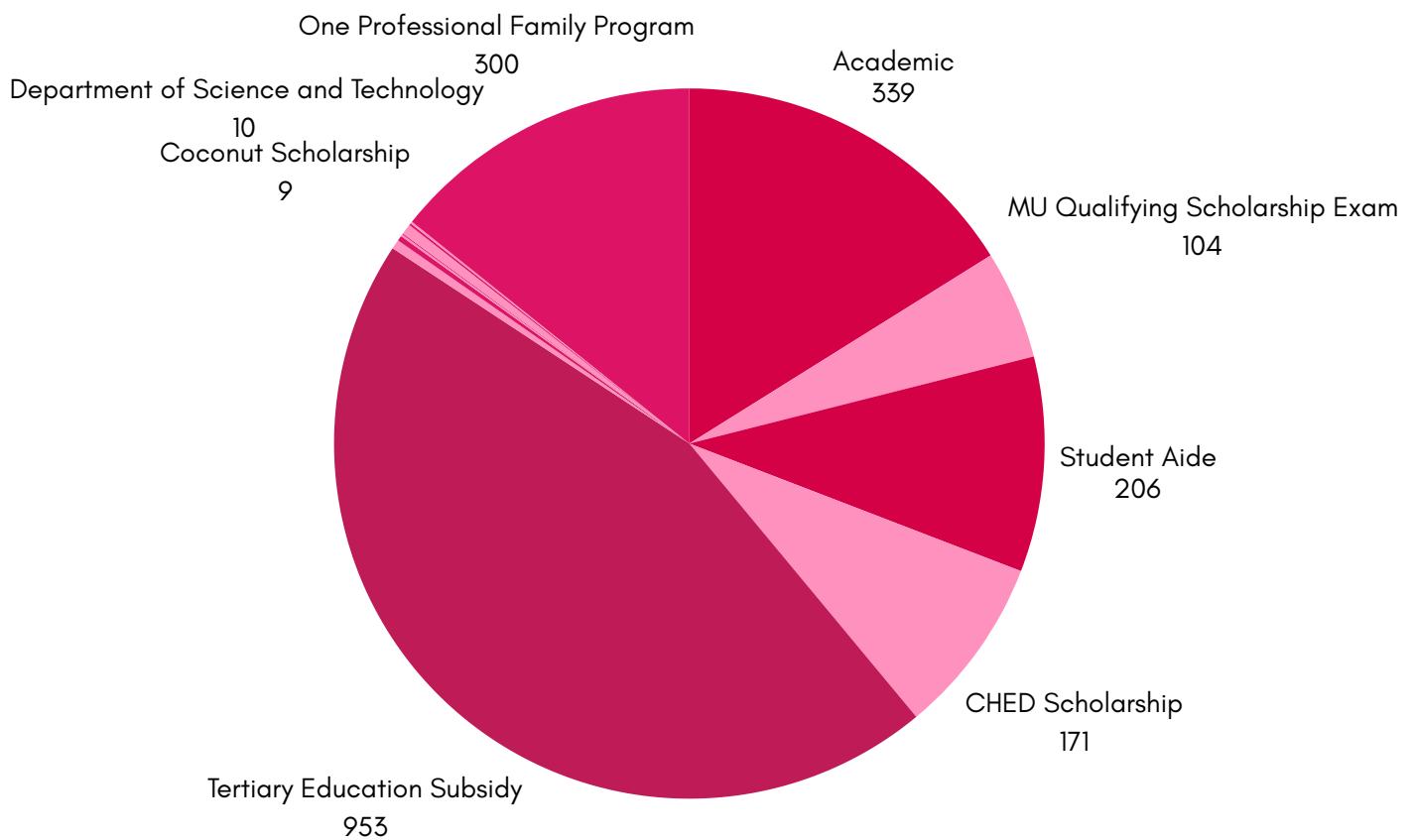

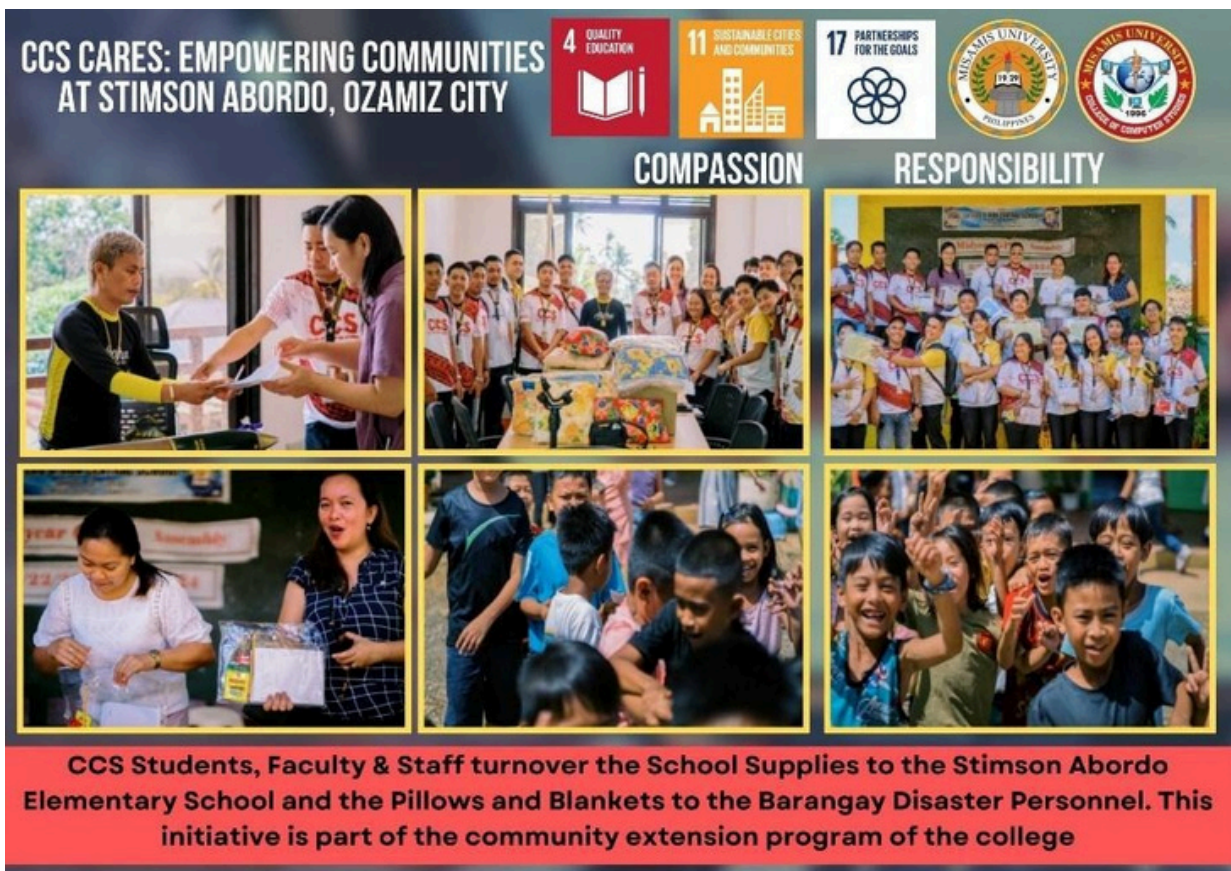
MU COLLEGE OF EDUCATION (CED): BANGKAL KINDER SCHOOL



Fostering a love for learning, Misamis University's College of Education brought early literacy to life at Bangkal Kinder School through daily interactive sessions. This initiative, part of the college's ongoing commitment to nurturing young minds. An MU faculty conducts daily classes for early childhood education, as assisted by student-volunteers. Its annual programs include *Pasko sa Bangkal* gift-giving, *Moving Up Ceremony*, and the *Adopt-a-Child* program (solicitation).



PROMOTING INCLUSIVE COMMUNITY SUPPORT THROUGH THE BRGY. STIMSON ABORDO GIFT-GIVING INITIATIVE



Misamis University, through its College of Computer Studies, advanced its commitment to inclusive community development by conducting a targeted gift-giving initiative in Brgy. Stimson Abordo, addressing the needs of vulnerable households, learners, and disaster personnel. Anchored on Sustainable Development Goal 10 (Reduced Inequalities) and aligned with national and local efforts to strengthen social protection and community resilience, the activity provided essential educational supplies to elementary students and distributed pillows and blankets to barangay disaster responders. By collaborating with barangay officials and local schools, MU ensured that assistance was responsive to actual community needs, fostering social inclusion, enhancing preparedness, and promoting civic engagement among CCS students, faculty, and staff.




EMPOWERING SECOND CHANCES: CLEP OUTREACH ON GOOD CONDUCT TIME ALLOWANCE LAW AT OZAMIZ CITY JAIL




On May 6, 2025, the Misamis University College of Law, through its Clinical Legal Education Program (CLEP), conducted a transformative Outreach and Legal Education Activity for Persons Deprived of Liberty (PDLs) at the Ozamiz City Jail. With the theme “Empowering Second Chances: Understanding the Good Conduct Time Allowance Law for a Brighter Future,” the initiative aimed to raise legal awareness, foster hope, and empower incarcerated individuals to exercise their rights and access available opportunities for rehabilitation. Guided by CLEP Adviser Atty. Lulu Enerio and supported by College of Law Officer-in-Charge Atty. Rabindranath S. Polito, and featuring an inspiring lecture by Atty. Margarette B. Angulo, the program reinforced inclusive, accountable, and participatory institutions, promoting access to justice and the rule of law for marginalized communities.
