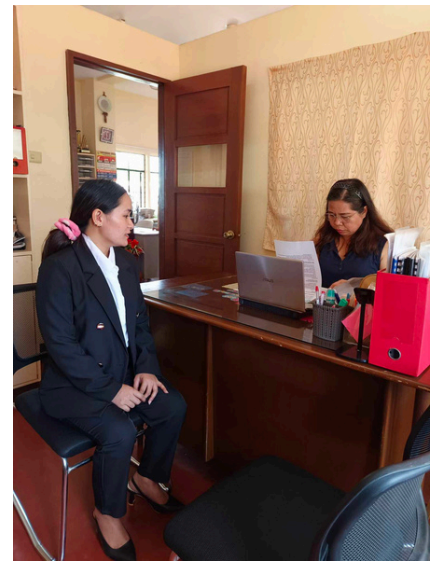

EXIT ASSESSMENT FOR STUDENT INTERNS: ENSURING JOB- READINESS AND WORKFORCE COMPETENCY




Misamis University's College of Computer Studies (CCS) reinforces its commitment to producing work-ready graduates by implementing an Exit Assessment for BSIT and BSCS interns, ensuring job-readiness and industry-aligned competencies. Guided by the university's philosophy, vision, mission, and objectives, the CCS internship policy requires students to complete all professional courses before industry immersion and to undergo at least 486 hours of supervised training in CHED-accredited local or international IT companies. To validate practical learning, CCS administers a comprehensive four-part Exit Assessment—including theoretical knowledge, software engineering, network administration, and professional readiness—that contributes to the students' final internship grade. This initiative strengthens the alignment between academic preparation and labor market needs, equips graduates with the skills and confidence required for employment, and directly supports SDG 8 by fostering inclusive, productive, and sustainable workforce participation.
